Supplemental Material S5. This figure illustrates how students are taught use target root meanings to analyze meanings of additional root-related words.

Use the Latin Root with a Root-Related Word (3 minutes) (Student Book, p. 13)

- · Everyone, spell the root that means "life." Let's try using v-i-v for a new word.
- · Let's look at the sentence and the picture of the girl jumping.
- Ask a student to read the sentence: Things are always exciting when Carla is with us because she is so vivacious. Who sees a root hiding in vivacious? Spell it. Box it.
- What does v-i-v mean? Have students write, "life" underneath and draw an arrow from the root to the meaning.



- So, if someone is vivacious, what does that mean?
 Guide students to the idea that someone vivacious is full of LIFE and fun to be around.
- We call vivacious a root-related word since it has the same root as our word survive.
 Write vivacious on the chart in the root-related words column, and have students do the same.
- See the root v-i-v in these words?
